## What is a Supported Music Lesson?

Supported Music Lessons are instrument lessons for individuals with additional needs. Supported Music Lessons are provided by experienced music tutors, who have additional training and lots of patience. You will learn technical and theoretical skills on your chosen instrument and will work towards performing, reading, notation, composing and/or improvising.

## How do Supported Music Lessons differ from other music schools?

Our tutors have an understanding of the complexities of disability. They have extensive experience in non-typical strategies for communicating and aiding students to understand information and to make learning enjoyable and stress free..

Our tutors are supported by our Registered Music Therapists who assist with strategies to accommodate unique learning styles and needs. For example, a visual timetable of the lesson may be provided or extra tactile input for sensory seekers.

## What instruments do you offer?

We currently offer piano, drum, guitar and voice lessons, but please contact us if you're looking for a different instrument.

## Who are Supported Music Lessons for?

Supported Music Lessons are for those seeking a flexible learning environment to increase confidence, and/or nurture an interest in learning an instrument.
